Serving with you in Cambodia with Trans World Radio: Paul and Kathy

We're Island Bound . . .

We have some exciting news to share. . . we are living and working on Guam for six months!!! Paul has been asked to join the Guam team as they put in two 250-kilowatt shortwave transmitters. They have quite a bit of work ahead to move the two large transmitters into their transmitter building, and to do some building modifications. One big project will be to put in air conditioners (transmitters will be air conditioned rather than using outside air as they currently do) and of course moving, installing, and getting the transmitters on the air. Thus Paul's help will be valuable to the team. Kathy has tagged along too and hopes to help perhaps with tracking the progress of the project through story writing. As you read this, we will already be on Guam, but plan a return to Cambodia on January 11. Because we will be gone for so long, and because we feel we can find cheaper housing when we return, we have put our things into storage.

We won't be "leaving" the staff in Cambodia entirely, as we plan to keep in contact with them, to be available for any questions they may have, and Kathy will continue to help with their monthly reports. While the staff is sad to see us go, they are happy to know that we plan to return to complete our term with them until the spring of 2012.

I am so happy that the Lord opened the door for you to come to the orphanage today so that I could meet you and thank you. TWR Guam has acquired two 250-kilowatt shortwave transmitters that have been recently refurbished. In addition, these newer transmitters have the added feature of digital technology. Digital-capable transmitters reach both cities and rural areas clearly. Digital shortwave broadcasting will enhance TWR's Asia ministry by:

- ◆ Reaching both rural areas and large cities across Asia with a strong "near FM" quality signal
- ◆ Reducing the fading and interference possible with an analog signal in noisy cities
- ◆ Reaching clearly into China's house churches, where people gather to listen in groups
- ◆ Consuming less power and reducing operating costs
- ◆ Being ahead of India's digital broadcast timeline of 2013, and 2017 in all of Asia, by distributing radios in the region
- ◆ Adding the ability for TWR to broadcast text to listeners' LCD screen receivers
- ◆ More effective use of music
- ◆ Allowing TWR's shortwave broadcasts to continue reliably for another 10 to 15 years
