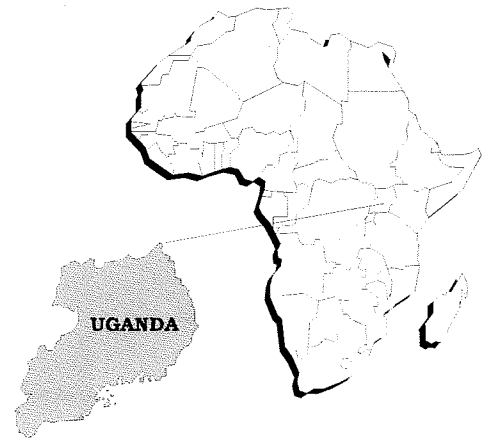

MEDICAL MISSIONS WEEK

From August 30 through September 3, Kampala Baptist Church (KBC) held its annual Medical Missions Week. Medical Missions Week was instituted in the early 2000's by Ugandan medical personnel attending KBC who felt God calling them to show the love of Christ in a very practical way to the community in which KBC is located. While many of those who started Medical Missions Week have moved on, their vision continues to burn brightly and Medical Missions Week is now one of the most anticipated weeks of the year at KBC. At the conclusion of this year's Medical Missions Week, KBC's senior pastor, Andrew Mwenge commented that the week was the highlight of his year because of the way in which the God's people ministered together Monday through Friday.

Some of the noteworthy happenings of the week included the following:

- 2,354 people came for treatment.
- God graciously provided the \$6,000 that was needed to minister to all those people.
- 300 people saw an optician, received reading glasses and can now read.
- 351 people received free HIV/AIDS testing and counseling. Of those, at least 31 tested positive.
- 39 children who had been sexually abused were tested for HIV. Thankfully, none of them tested positive.
- Over 70 people prayed to accept Christ as their savior following morning devotions and counseling.
- 120 volunteers served as registrars, ushers, counselors, doctors, nurses, ophthalmologists, pharmacists, go-fers and helpers wherever needed. At considerable sacrifice, some Ugandans even took the week off from work in order to participate in Medical Missions Week.
- Of those 120 volunteers, approximately 20 came from the U.K. and the U.S. to work together with those from KBC. What a beautiful picture of God's world-wide family joining together to show His compassion to those in need.

- 121 that those who accepted Christ as their Savior would begin to regularly attend a church where Christ is honored and that they would continue to grow spiritually.
- 122 for four young women who were particularly devastated after learning that they were HIV+. PRAY that they would come to know the Savior and that they would continue to receive wise medical and spiritual counsel.
- 123 for the many children in Uganda who are sexually abused. PRAY that they would have an opportunity to learn about Jesus' love for them and that He would bring spiritual and emotional healing to their lives.
- 124 that the spirit of harmony, selfless service and gracious sharing of the Gospel that typifies Medical Missions Week would continue throughout the year among those who attend KBC.

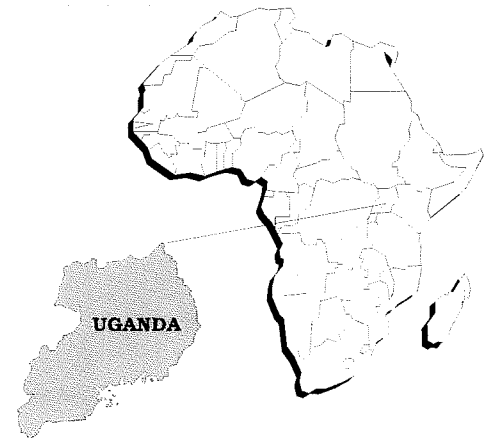

MEDICAL MISSIONS WEEK

Some of the noteworthy happenings of the week included the following:

- 2,354 people came for treatment.
- God graciously provided the \$6,000 that was needed to minister to all those people.
- 300 people saw an optician, received reading glasses and can now read.

- 120 volunteers served as registrars, ushers, counselors, doctors, nurses, ophthalmologists, pharmacists, go-fers and helpers wherever needed. At considerable sacrifice, some Ugandans even took the week off from work in order to participate in Medical Missions Week.
- Of those 120 volunteers, approximately 20 came from the U.K. and the U.S. to work together with those from KBC. What a beautiful picture of God's world-wide family joining together to show His compassion to those in need.
